INSTRUCTIONS

Part ONE: Complete as NOTES or a CHART

Part TWO: Complete in PARAGRAPHS



3. Look closely at the time period, the setting, and the locales of the text and discuss whether the new setting is satisfying given what you know about Brontë's world and locations.
4. Examine the characters as they are laid out in the new text and explain whether they lived up to your expectations for them, based on the original text.
5. Consider the intent of the author, as presented by the text. How does the text successfully or unsuccessfully include the search for identity, love, accomplishment, family, respect, etc.? And what social issues does it raise that are important to the character and the time?

Part THREE: Complete as a newspaper REVIEW

6. Finally, prepare a book review with the cover, title, author, and brief summary of the story (without spoilers) to put up in the classroom.

INSTRUCTIONS

Part ONE: Complete as NOTES or a CHART
